PRECISION has a zero-tolerance approach to all forms of modern slavery within its operations and supply chains.

PRECISION is committed to acting ethically and with integrity in all its business dealings and relationships.

This policy outlines **PRECISION's** commitment to complying with the requirements of the Modern Slavery Act 2018

(the Act), by ensuring all individuals working on behalf of **PRECISION** are aware of **PRECISION**'s commitment to the

prevention, detection and reporting of modern slavery in any part of **PRECISION's** operations and supply chains.

Who is PRECISION?

PRECISION is a contractor on construction projects.

It is a large Interior walls & ceilings company with an office Brisbane **PRECISION** has over 200 employees.

What is modern slavery?

Under the Act, modern slavery takes various forms including trafficking in persons, slavery, servitude, forced, marriage, forced labour, debt bondage, deceptive recruiting for labour or services and the worst forms of child

labour (including where children are subjected to slavery or similar practices, or engaged in hazardous work).

How is PRECISION addressing modern slavery?

PRECISION is committed to do everything within our power to address all forms of modern slavery risks in our operations and supply chains.

More specifically, we are committed to taking proactive steps to prevent, detect and report modern slavery practices, and to ensuring that people at all levels of our supply chains do the same.

To put these commitments into practice, **PRECISION** has resolved to:

- Educate its staff, contractors and suppliers about the risks of modern slavery practices;
- Identify and monitor our supply chains, and particularly those that are at the greatest risk of being prone to

modern slavery practices;

• Do everything within its power to ensure that we do not directly or indirectly engage contractors or suppliers

who may engage in modern slavery practices;

• Report and take other appropriate action if any modern slavery practices are discovered in our operations

and supply chains; and

• Measure the effectiveness of our systems on an ongoing basis, so that we may continuously refine and

improve our policies and processes.
